HURRICANE HARVEY: HOW TO HELP

Freeport, TX (September 8, 2017) - Below is information on where to donate, volunteer or receive assistance in Harvey's aftermath:

BRAZORIA COUNTY HARVEY RECOVERY FUND: Monetary donations only. Text Harvey2017 to 41444 to donate to the Brazoria County United Way. Funds will be used by Brazoria County Long-Term Recovery Committee for disaster recovery. Donations also can be made through the UWBC website: buff.ly/2xDPbsv. The UWBC office in Angleton is closed until further notice due to telecommunications issues and safety concerns.

SALVATION ARMY: Monetary donations to the Salvation Army to support Hurricane Harvey relief efforts can be made online at www.salvationarmytexas.org/freeport/, helpsalvationarmy.org, by calling 1-800- SAL-ARMY or by texting STORM to 51555.

SHELTER VOLUNTEERS: Those wishing to volunteer at a shelter can contact the Brazoria County Citizens Corps at homelandpreparedness.org. An application and brief training process are required.

SHELTER FOOD DONATIONS: Bring perishable and non-perishable food to the Salvation Army branch at 1618 N. Ave. J in Freeport. All donations will be distributed within the county.

MOST HOLY TRINITY CATHOLIC CHURCH: The parish has set up its hall at 1713 N. Tinsley St. in Angleton to distribute clothing and other donations to those who have had to evacuate their homes because of Tropical Storm Harvey. Food, toiletry and clothing donations will be accepted. Call 979-849-2421

SPCA OF BRAZORIA COUNTY: Needs volunteers and donations. Those wishing to volunteer should show up at 141 Canna Lane in Lake Jackson between 8 a.m. and 5 p.m. A secondary shelter is open at the Brazoria County Fairgrounds between 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. Volunteer shifts are four hours each. Items most needed are large and extra-large crates, bedding (bath rugs, old towels or comforters), and monetary donations. Drop items or mail checks to 141 Canna Lane, Lake Jackson TX 77566, or call 979-285-2340.

LIFE FOURSQUARE CHURCH: Members will be making dinner every day except Wednesdays for the people sheltered in Angleton, and will assist with cleanup after the flood. The church is at 501 Karankawa St. in Angleton. Monetary donations may be made at give.church/al0a11c/give. Call 979-849-1161.

DOCTORS, NURSES NEEDED: Physicians and registered nurses who would like to donate their time and expertise are asked to visit any of the following fire departments: Angleton, Lake Jackson, Freeport, Brazoria, Danbury, Alvin, Pearland, Manvel, Liverpool, Iowa Colony or Sweeny.

BRAZORIA COUNTY DREAM CENTER: Donations of food, personal hygiene items, new and used clothing are being accepted at the building at 7962 S. Highway 288-B, from 9 a.m. to noon and 1:30 to 5:30 p.m. daily through Saturday, September 9th.
